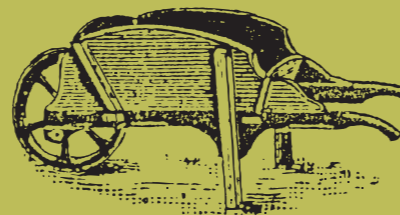

DID YOU KNOW?



Hawarden had two Corn Mills (higher and lower) in the Middle Ages, both of which were rebuilt in the eighteenth century. The ruins of the mill built by Sir John Glynne can still be seen, by taking the foot-path from the Tinkersdale Car Park into the Bilberry Wood. For a short time in the 1870's it was powered by steam instead of water, and only ceased production in the 1940's.
