562/17 SECTION 106 MONIES: ASTON MEAD

The Clerk had sought three quotes for the replacement fencing at Aston Bowling Club and, following a request from local Members, for the Community Centre. A discussion ensued about the boundary responsibilities and Section 106 monies being used for this purpose.

The Clerk reiterated that the Council had only approved the scheme in principle, as the project would be subject to all necessary consultations and consents etc.

Councillor Joyce Angell asked if the "No Ball Games" sign could be removed from the pavilion building along with some graffiti that had recently appeared. Councillor Angell also requested that dog fouling signs be erected as some dog owners had not been picking up dog waste around the Gladstone Playing Fields.
