The Clerk advised that the section 106 money for Circular Drive, Ewloe had been progressed by the Chairman and that he had been assured that the cheque had been raised with the Finance Director at the Building Company but not yet been signed. The County Council had indicated that legal proceedings would commence if no further progress could be made.

She also said that Kevin Griffiths had recently undertaken a night time inspection of the street lights and that there had been a total of 18 faulty lights across the three Councils that would be added to the repair list.
